SCHOOL UNIFORM



- Black blazer with blue trim and school badge
- Black trousers or blue/black tartan skirt
- White shirt

Students must also attend school with a sensible hair style, which is not extreme or which includes unnatural bright colouring or outrageous hair patterns. Hair bands if worn, must be simple and plain.

Students should be well presented at all times, with shirts tucked in to their trousers and skirts.

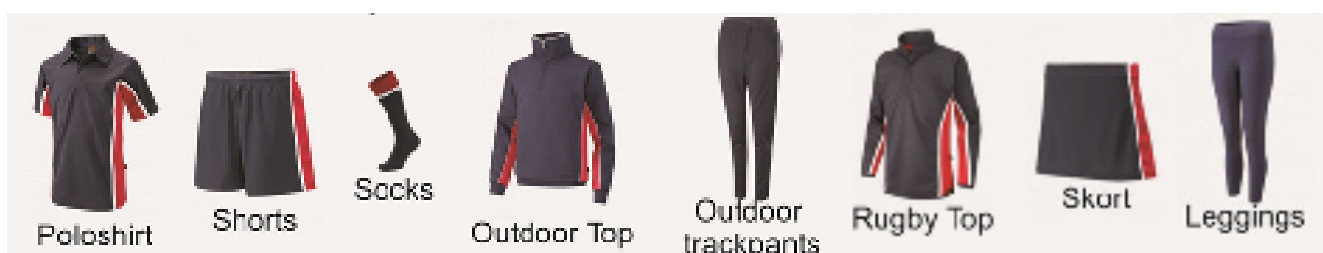
PE KIT

All students must have the PE socks and then a top and bottom from the selection below. Students do not have to purchase all of the items below, but can choose to do so. Students are expected to bring appropriate footwear to all PE lessons to enable them to engage fully with learning. Students require a clean pair of trainers suitable for indoor and outdoor lessons.

At times during the year, students will undertake PE outside. If students have studded boots suitable for use on grass or our 3G surface, then these are encouraged for outdoor PE lessons as an alternative to trainers.

Students have the option to wear base layers underneath their PE kit, particularly during cold weather. We request that students choose navy blue or black garments that complement our school uniform.

The safety of our students is paramount when taking part in PE, so we would encourage you to purchase a pair of shin pads and a suitable mouthguard for use in Football, Rugby, and Hockey.

ATTENDANCE & PUNCTUALITY

We expect you to maintain an attendance record of 97% or higher at school. This will ensure you are in the best position to fulfil your potential. If, however, you are ill or unable to attend, or you will be late to school for any reason, then your parent/carer **must** telephone the school by 9.00am. You **must** provide a note written by your parent/carer explaining why you were absent on the first morning of your return to school.

In order that you do not fall behind others in your class, you will be expected to catch up on work you have missed during your absence.

REWARDS

At The Grange Academy you will be rewarded in a range of different ways for following our core values and behaviour code, working hard and attending regularly.

CURRICULUM

We pride ourselves on offering a broad and balanced curriculum that will allow you to develop skills across a range of subjects. Students will study a three year KS3 curriculum designed to offer breadth and depth, developing skills and knowledge to a high standard before they begin their KS4 studies. Within KS3 students study:

SMSC, Careers and Modern British Values are embedded throughout our curriculum, with additional form times, drop down mornings and focus weeks ensuring students have strong cultural understanding.



HOMework & REVISION

Homework is a vital part of school life. It is used to compliment the work you complete in your lessons and provide you with opportunities to work independently. Each subject will provide homework in line with the school homework policy which will be shared with students on Microsoft Teams.

Microsoft Teams is a versatile online platform that allows for homework to be set in a variety of ways. Students will also have access to previous in-school learning through the platform which will help with home learning and revision.

Revision is extremely important. As you will undertake assessments throughout each year it is essential that you are in the habit of regular revision. It is recommended that you take a "little and often" approach, looking at one or two subjects each night for around 30-40 minutes.

DINING ARRANGEMENTS

The school is open in the morning for breakfast from 8.00am to 8.30am.

Our students remain on the school premises during break time and lunch time.

At break time, students are able to purchase a variety of items such as toast, muffins and bacon/sausage barmes.

There are a wide range of choices that you can have at lunch time:

- **A packed lunch from home**
- **Sandwiches, wraps and baguettes**
- **Pasta pots (hot or cold)**
- **A variety of hot meals with a different offering each day**

We operate a cashless system at The Grange where students preload money onto their accounts through SCOPAY or designated machines. Students then use their finger print or unique code to purchase food.



RESULTS

Despite the challenging circumstances of 2021, Year 11 students left The Grange Academy with a set of results that were a true reflection of their hard work and ability. These results demonstrated improvements across the school in Core, Ebacc and Foundation subjects and fantastic pass rates in a wide range of subjects. In addition to this, there were some outstanding individual achievements

100% of students achieved a Grade 9 - 4 in GCSE Design Technology

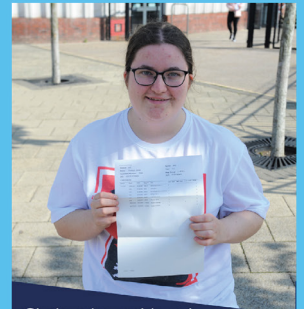

CHALLENGE PARTNERS FEEDBACK

In February 2022, Challenge Partners carried out an independent review, led by a lead Ofsted inspector.
