YR7	Children will learn how to proficiently apply tone with pencil and colour pencil. They will begin to understand how tone can be created using line and direction of line. They will utilise these skills to create a realistic observational drawing.	Children will look at colour theory in more detail, learning about primary, secondary and tertiary colours and will be able to demonstrate how to mix them. They will look at the work of famous artists to explore the connotations of colour and be able to write about the impact colour can have on a piece of work using the language of art and design.	This final project allows students to explore, in depth the final elements of art: form and pattern. After completing research and analysis the children will take inspiration from contemporary artists Mark Hearld and Helen Wells to design and construct a 3D bird that will be used in a classroom installation. This mix media project will piece together what they have learnt prior and allow them to apply their knowledge of colour theory, texture and tone to their final outcome.
