




Keys, Scales and Chords

Scale		Key											
<p><i>A pattern of notes that go up and down in a specific order</i></p> <p>Each minor or major scale is made up of seven notes before it is then repeated.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">A Minor Scale</p>  <p style="text-align: center;">C Major Scale</p> 		<p>A key is a collection of notes that make up a scale. The notes found in the key make up the melody and harmony of the music.</p> <p>Depending on how the notes relate to one another, the key can either be a major key (warm and happy) or a minor key (cold and sad).</p> <p>Each major key has a relative minor key. The relative minor always begins on the 6th note of every major scale.</p>											
Chords of a key													
<p>A chord is group of notes played together at the same time.</p> <p>A triad is a type of chord that groups three evenly spaced notes together.</p> <p>In each key there are seven chords related to the seven notes of the scale.</p> <p>Each key has three major triad chords and three minor triad chords. It also has a diminished triad that sounds clashy.</p>
